CA Dept. of Alcohol and Drug Programs - Admin Per Se Fact

In 1990, California implemented a mandatory driver's license suspension law for drunk drivers, also known as "Admin Per Se".

- OHS accepts Admin Per Se as proof of requirement to enroll in a DUI program prior to the defendant's court appearance. This may allow DMV to reinstate driving privileges.

Recent Legislative Changes for Driving Under the Influence Offenders

Senate Bill SB 598-Huff 2009: New California Law Gives Drivers Convicted Of 2nd Or 3rd DUI The Option To Get A Restricted License Sooner.

Previously, penalties for a 2nd DUI included a mandatory one-year suspension of driving privileges, while a 3rd DUI had a mandatory two year suspension. Now, 2nd offenders who violated after 7/1/10 can reinstate their license after 90 days while 3rd offenders become eligible after 180 days with proof of installation of an Ignition Interlock Device (IID) and enrollment in a DUI Program.
